B.S.T. (Blut, Schweiß und Tränen) from Hamburg did a live concert. The stream is available.





Change the screen of a Lynx II:

A how-to assemble BennVenn's LCD Replacement Kit Rev 5

The Atari Lynx was build at the beginning of the nineteens. It's already around thirty years old.

When the Lynx was released, the colour screen was among the main reasons to buy one.

The screen became pale when time goes by. You got used to it, and after a while, it was even natural to have a pale screen.

By exchanging the screen, you could get a new game feeling because of bright colours.



This picture shows the original screen. Even that the backlight set to the maximum, you could see that the screen is pale. It looks like fog.

I thought long about exchanging the screens of my various Lynx. But when I read that the exchange now could be done without any soldering, I thought, now is the time to try out modding one my Lynx.

Ordering from BenVenn's webshop was straightforward. In the order confirmation, I read that the shop is in Australia, so I had some days time to prepare :-)

Between the years, finally was the right time to start the assembling. The documentation writes that it should take 5 minutes, but I thought it would take a little longer.

It took me 45 minutes, but therefore the first try was successful. I could recommend the LCD replacement kit. On the following pages, I like to explain what I did.

Tools:

- 1x slotted screwdriver
- 1x cross screwdriver
- 1x scissors


That's how the LCD Replacement Kit is delivered. Below the sticker, there is the LCD screen




The other side. Later you use the orange frame to fix the screen to the exact position



The content of the bag: 1x Fixing frame, 1x LCD Bildschirm, 1x Connector foil, 1x Sticker



The content without the LCD screen packaging. On top of the screen, there is still the protection foil

Put the Lynx on a table. First, remove the old screen before you assemble the new one.



Remove the rubber feet left and right. I used a screwdriver to pull them up, and then I deducted them.



Now the four screws could be unscrewed



After removing the back cover, the mainboard is visible.



Also, unscrew the screws of the battery pocket




Remove the battery pocket itself



The front and the mainboard are connected via one cable and two connector foils




Use the slotted screwdriver to pull off the orange connector from the mainboard



The orange connector on the other site is also pulled off the mainboard with the help of the slotted screwdriver




Open the clamp that holds the white cable with the slotted screwdriver and pull of the connector



Open the clamp of the orange connector foil with the screwdriver. Then pull out the foil. Unscrew the old screen and pull it out. The removal is now complete!




Remove the protection foil from the new screen and put it into the front cover



Fix the LCD screen with the fixing frame. Next, screw the screen to the front cover with the four screws. The assemble of the LCD screen is finished. Now we have to cut out an Inductor from the mainboard




Use the slotted screwdriver to pry out the component (L17 Inductor). The component sits left of the enormous spool.




The clamp for the white connector cable is removable. You could put the cable in the clamp.



Connect the cable with the clamp into the connector and close the clamp. **Test if it's impossible to pull out the cable of the clamp!**



Open the clamp for the connector foil. Insert the new connector foil into the clamp. **The foil must snap.** Then close the clamp



Put the other end of the connector foil into the clamp of the LCD screen. Next, close the clamp. **This action requires patience!**



Put the mainboard into the front cover. The assemble of the LCD screens is now complete!



Now test if the new screen works and everything is connected in the right way. Plug in a power supply and a cartridge, and power on the Lynx. The picture shows the difference compared to the first foggy picture. Bride colours let the Lynx look as if it is brand new. After the test, you will finish the reassemble of the Lynx



Put back the battery pocket and screw it



Put the back cover back onto the front cover



Screw in the four screws to fasten front cover, mainboard and back cover



Put back the rubber feet and press them hard into the correct position



The exchange of the LCD screen is now complete, and you could start gaming. Many thanks to BennVenn and Retrogamer.com for this great Kit and the very detailed and easy-to-follow instructions.

After seeing the fullscreen screenshots on four pages, It was clear to me that I never saw such an improvement in a genre before.



Meeting report: VSTmt #9

While people came in, we tested some new multiplayer games on Steam. **Quest hunter** gave us a good feeling. **Burning Knight** seems to be a great game, but the Co-Op mode is a little bit buggy.

When we were four people, we switched to the Switch. We started to play **Zombiland Double Tap**. This time we made it to at least the 2nd level. The game is not that easy but, therefore, challenging and funny. The available weapons are well balanced, and the story is also amusing.

Next, we played **Spelunky Party**. The game is a sequel to Spelunker, a true 8 Bit classic well known for its challenging level design. Spelunky Party offers up to four split screens. Ideal for a gaming meeting. You have to discover corridors and collect items to solve riddles. You also have to avoid stones falling from above, and you have to jump from ropes to ropes (reminds on Jungle Hunt). A funny game.

Then we played **Ultima racing 2D**. The game is a top-down view racer with up to four split screens. Super Cars without weapons, you could say. The control of the cars is brilliant. Up to 20 cars could race against each other. That's why there is a lot of action on the track. There are many different classes of cars and bikes and configuration options available, including tire changing in the race.

After a pizza break, we played **Horizon Chase**. The racer is already a classic in our meetings.

Wolf, who was not able to appear physically, joined online. So for the first time, we enhanced our local co-op gaming with online players. Mixed Co-Op gaming meetings!

Together we played **Broforce**. Wolf opened an online session, and we local ones joined. We have to investigate which other games support this setup.

Another game that supports Mixed Co-Op is **Fifa**. It looks like all local players then play together against the online player. We have to google if there are other options. Anyway, we had a lot of fun.

We continued locally to test some more Steam games. **Slipstream** is a racer similar to Horizon Chase. On the other side, it's unique, cause the cars are bigger and the aim is to get into the slipstream. Also, most of the time, you are drifting. We will play next time with four players.

We also played **Bloody Tapland**. It's a jump & run game where you have to avoid traps (or more or less everything). The difficulty level is high. You aim to finish a screen (level) before one of the other players.

There were two new joysticks for the Atari, which I did not test so far. One is called **Tropper** the other one is the stick from **Retro Radionics**. Neewalix and I tried both by playing **Kick Off** on the ST. The Tropper is excellent. Look like a CX-40 but has two buttons. Important for left-handers like me. My new favorite stick became the Radionics Stick. My Kick Off was never as accurate as playing with this stick.

Finally at 6 am in the morning we stopped gaming.


